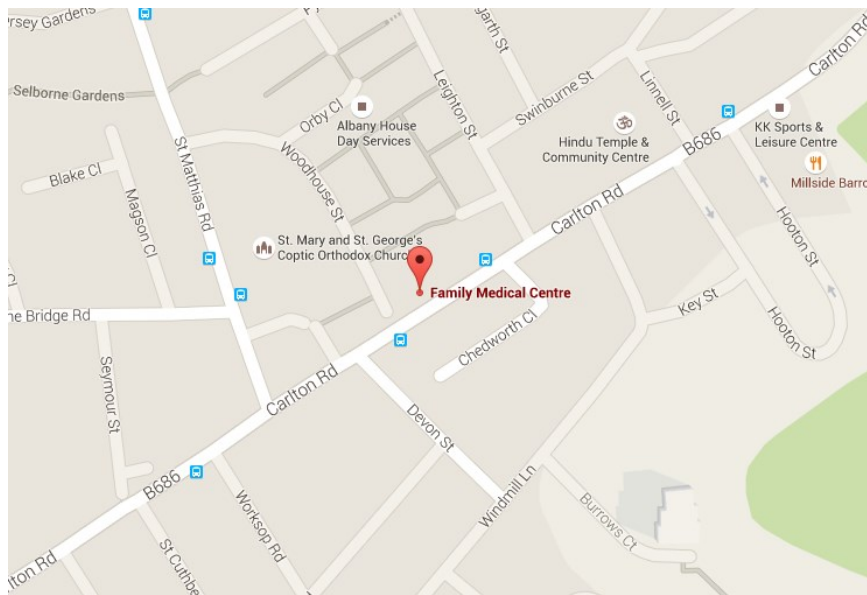

- Please tick those which you require and put the slip in the box at reception. If required by post, please enclose an SAE. We regret that it is only possible to take telephone requests from the housebound.
- A number of local chemists offer a home delivery service, but you will need to speak to them directly.

## Registration

To register, you need to fill in a GMS1 form, available from the surgery or online from the website. All patients at the Family Medical Centre can see any of the doctors practicing there. Your registration will be processed within a few days.

## Appointments

To make an appointment please contact the surgery on **0115 950 4068**. The receptionist will ask you for a brief description of your problem which would help the doctor to decide who is the best person to see you and when. You will either be booked an appointment or put on the doctors "call back" list and they will call you and decide on the best way forward. For a morning please ring from 8.00am for afternoon after 12.30pm

## Emergencies

If you think there is a medical emergency, please let the receptionists know, and you will be put through to the doctor on call.

## Cancellations

**If you are unable to come to an appointment please cancel it as soon as possible, so that another patient can benefit. Missed appointments are the main reason why patients may have to wait to see a doctor.**

## Home Visits

Please try to come to the surgery, if possible. If you do need a home visit please try to ring before 10.30 am. The receptionist will need to know a few details about the problem, so that the doctor can decide which visits, if any, need to be done first. If you require an urgent visit the reception staff will put you through to the doctor on call.



## What to do if the Surgery is Closed

Please do not call between 6.30 pm and 8.00 am, unless you are in urgent need of medical advice or attention. If you do ring, you will be advised to ring 111 and they will triage the call. They may then divert you to the Nottingham Emergency Medical Service, who will deal with the problem.

The receptionists treat all information in the strictest of confidence. They are employed to help you, as well as the doctors. Please remember that their job isn't always easy.

### Practice Nurses: Julie Marlow, Debbie Cooke, Vicky Hammond

Our practice nurses, who are all Practice Nurse Specialists, can advise you on a wide range of health problems. For example: General health checks; Coronary heart disease; Asthma; Diabetes; COPD; Blood pressure; Travel and contraceptive advice. All patients over 75 are offered an annual health check with a practice nurse. They also carry out blood tests, removal of stitches, dressing of wounds, vaccinations, immunisations, cervical smear tests, ECG's and Ear syringing .

The nurses run a variety of clinics, together with doctors.

Appointments Monday to Friday our nurse practitioner sees and treats minor illnesses and injuries along with a variety of other problems.

A message can be left for the nurses, regarding test results or general advice and they will ring you back in the next few days.

## Phlebotomy Services and HCAs

Mary ,Angela Azra and Jo are our phlebotomists, will take blood, by appointment only. They are also available for blood pressure checks flu vacs . Azra and Jo are Health Care Assistants and also do ECG, dressings, and other procedures

### Midwife: Jo Smedley

She will coordinate your antenatal care, arranging hospital scans, antenatal classes, and other services to support you during your pregnancy and with your new baby. She is based at St Anns Health Centre.

### Health Visitors : Chimwemwe Chideya and team

The Baby Clinic is for all children under 5.

Thursday afternoon drop in 1.30-3.00 pm.

A doctor is available 2.00-3.00 pm.

A nurse is available for immunisations from 2.00-3.00 pm.

The health visitors have a particular interest in your child's progress, from birth to school age, and are qualified to discuss a wide range of problems. For example: Sleeping; Eating; Behaviour; Toileting etc. If you would like to talk to them, they can be seen at the clinic, or by making an appointment directly with them for another time.

Child development checks are by appointment arranged by the health visiting team.

### Visiting Doctors

As a training practice, we have qualified Registrars and Foundation doctors with us, who are fully qualified doctors gaining experience in general practice, after working in hospitals. Sometimes we will also have locum doctors standing in whilst your doctor is away.

### Visiting Students

We are committed to education and research, so you may find that a medical or nursing student or a pharmacist is sitting in with a doctor. The receptionists will tell you if this is the case, and should you prefer to see the doctor alone, they will be happy to arrange this.
